

## Cultivating Climate Literacy to young climate leaders in Arusha and Dar es Salaam region | Partnered with Climate KIC.

Climate Hub Tanzania partnered with <u>Climate KIC</u> to implement a program cultivating climate literacy with a special nexus on climate change and gender based violence among young climate leaders in the Arusha and Dar es Salaam regions.

The project's goal was to empower young climate leaders to understand climate change issues from the root causes, to the opportunities in the climate space such as green jobs but also the nexus of gender equality into climate change impacts. The project had a special focus on the connection between climate change and GBV given the impacts of climate change disproportionately affects women.

The project capacitated 54 young leaders, with a ratio of 36: 18 women to men respectively with comprehensive climate knowledge and skills to effectively address climate challenges and build a network of informed climate advocates in the Arusha and Dar es Salaam regions.

Climate fellows had the opportunity to participate in a series of workshops, seminars, and online training sessions on climate science, entrepreneurship, policy, and action. They also gained hands-on experience through community projects such as tree planting and organizing climate education sessions at Ilboru and Kaloleni secondary schools, focusing on environmental conservation. The project offered mentorship from climate experts to the young climate leaders and seed funds to support projects developed by the climate fellows.

We believe that youths are the ones experiencing the challenges of climate change. Providing knowledge and skills to young people will cultivate a green generation in the future capable of addressing the impacts of climate change.
