

Green schools tour in Dar es Salaam | Partnered with the Ministry of Union and Environment.

We were working together with the <u>Ministry of Union and Environment</u> for the implementation of the Green schools tour which developed to address the pressing need for environmental education and action within schools. Recognizing the growing threat of climate change and the importance of empowering youth to become environmental stewards,

The problem we aimed to tackle was the lack of sufficient environmental education and engagement opportunities for students, leading to a disconnect between youth and the pressing environmental issues of our time. Many schools lacked resources and structured programs to teach students about climate change and inspire them to take action in their communities.

We designed a multifaceted approach for the Green School Tour. We collaborated with local schools, including Sinza primary and Ubungo Secondary School, to deliver interactive workshops, presentations, and hands-on activities focused on climate change and environmental conservation. Partnering with the Ministry of Union and Environment, we organized tree planting events on school grounds, enhancing local biodiversity and promoting carbon sequestration. Additionally, we worked with school administrators and students to establish Climate Hub Clubs, providing a platform for ongoing environmental learning and action.

Students actively participated in tree planting activities, contributing to the restoration of local ecosystems and the fight against climate change. The establishment of Climate Hub Clubs fostered a sense of empowerment and community among students, enabling them to continue their environmental journey beyond the tour and succeeded in engaging and empowering the next generation of environmental leaders, laying the foundation for a more sustainable future.
