In collaboration with the Seychelles Consul in Tanzania, HUDEF0 and ECCT Organizations. The Climate Hub Tanzania tackled the pressing issue of excessive plastic and paper waste pollution plaguing the beautiful beaches of the Indian ocean in Dar es Salaam.

The problem was stark, with vast quantities of waste threatening both the local ecosystem and the broader fight against climate change. Our objectives were to stem the tide of pollution, educate key stakeholders, and instill sustainable practices. Through concerted efforts, we aimed to reduce waste, raise awareness among diverse groups, and promote lasting solutions.

We organized beach cleanup drives, mobilizing volunteers to remove 500 tonnes of waste, thereby restoring cleanliness to the shores. Concurrently, educational campaigns reached 439 individuals, spanning politicians, academia, children, and university students, imparting knowledge on waste reduction and recycling.

Crucially, we advocated for sustainable alternatives to single-use plastics while underscoring the importance of proper waste management.
